- Effectively use formative assessment to inform strategy and decisions
- Ensure the teaching of a broad, structured, and coherent curriculum
- Establish curriculum leadership, including subject leaders with relevant expertise and access to professional networks and communities
- Use valid, reliable, and proportionate approaches to assessing pupils' knowledge and understanding of the curriculum
- Ensure the use of evidence-informed approaches to reading so that all pupils are taught to read
- Work collaboratively with schools within The Golden Thread Alliance to share best practice and systems

Additional and special educational needs (SEN) and disabilities

Under the direction of the Head Teacher, the Deputy Headteacher will:

- Promote a culture and practices that enables all pupils to access the curriculum
- Have ambitious expectations for all pupils with SEN and disabilities
- Make sure the school works effectively with parents, carers, and professionals to identify additional needs and provide support and adaptation where appropriate
- Make sure the school fulfils statutory duties regarding the SEND Code of Practice.

Organisational management and school improvement

Under the direction of the Head Teacher, the Deputy Headteacher will:

- Establish and sustain the school's ethos and strategic direction together with the Local Governing Body and Trustees, and through consultation with the school community
- Establish and oversee systems, processes, and policies so this school can operate effectively
- Ensure staff and pupils' safety and welfare through effective approaches to safeguarding, as part of duty of care
- Manage staff well with due attention to workload

General	The Deputy Headteacher will have delegated responsibilities, which are both schoolwide and within The Golden Thread Alliance. This will be in addition to carrying out the statutory, professional duties of a teacher. The Deputy Headteacher will promote and support the vision and direction of Meopham Community Academy, playing a significant role, under the direction of the Head Teacher. If the Head Teacher is absent, the Deputy Headteacher will deputise, as directed by the Trust Leadership Team. In the absence of the Head Teacher, the Deputy Headteacher will also be expected to fulfil the professional responsibilities of the Head Teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document (STPCD).



Responsibilities for Data Protection	 Promote a culture of data protection within the school, ensuring that staff understand and adhere to data protection policies. Work closely with the DPO to implement and monitor data protection practices. Report any data breaches, potential breaches, or subject access requests (SARs) to the designated Data Protection Officer (DPO) and/or onsite data protection lead promptly. Review data protection concerns or breaches, ensuring that corrective actions are taken promptly. Ensure that all staff receive appropriate data protection training.

This includes any duties as may be reasonably directed by the Head Teacher, safeguarding and the accountabilities expected of class teachers.

Employees will be expected to comply with any reasonable request from a manager to undertake work of a similar level that is not specified in this job description. The job description will be reviewed from time to time to reflect the changes needs and circumstances of the school. Such reviews and any consequential changes will be carried out in consultation with the post holder.

The duties above are neither exclusive, nor exhaustive and the post holder may be required by the Headteacher to carry out appropriate duties within the context of the job, skills and grade.
