## HIGH ACADEMIC — STANDARDS

If students are to '**Dream Big and Achieve**' they require excellent academic results. Over recent years we have consistently performed above similar schools, including grades 8 - 9 (A\* equivalent).

### **Excellent academic progress is achieved through:**

- Consistently high-quality learning, ensuring the correct balance of challenge and support
- Excellent classroom behaviour, meaning that students can learn effectively
- A focus on individualised support, starting with strong assessment, leading to all students receiving exactly the help they require
- High expectations of homework to further learning outside school hours
- Effective use of ICT through our E-Learning Scheme
- A dedicated and caring staff team.

In addition to our mainstream learning, we operate the following programmes to support targeted groups of students:

### **Fast Track Programme**

Students capable of achieving the very highest grades and top future destinations, including Russell Group universities, are supported through the Fast Track Programme. This involves more challenging learning, targeted careers support and an additional enrichment programme in areas such as debating, strategic thinking, leadership skills and wider talent development.

### **Bespoke/transition pathway**

Some students struggle with transition into secondary school, with this in mind we operate a transition class. This smaller than average sized class group spend around two-thirds of the time with one teacher in a more primary style environment, with the remaining time in mainstream classes. Gradually, through Year 7, students are supported into full time mainstream classes and then offered, as required, a bespoke range of support for the remainder of their time at NSfG.

### Individualised special needs support

Our excellent special needs team is highly experienced at supporting students who may require additional support. All students on our SEN register are allocated a keyworker who supports and tracks progress. We always work closely with students and parents to ensure the best possible academic standards are achieved.





# HIGH EXPECTATIONS OF WHOLE PERSON DEVELOPMENT

Academic attainment is only part of supporting individuals to achieve an exciting future. We ensure all students leave with highly developed 'whole person' skills, including teamwork, self-reflection, resilience, problem solving and world mindedness. This is achieved through our 'Dream Big Programme' covering the following areas:

### **Dream Big days**

Students undertake a range of exciting challenges and experiences such as university days, debating skills, learning chess, careers tasters and community events. These ensure students develop as confident individuals with a clear plan for their future.

### **Enrichment clubs**

We operate a wide range of clubs to develop students' talents and skills, such as baking, boxing, trampolining, farm and cheerleading, please look on our school website or social media for the latest list. We ask all students to engage with at least one club every year, either developing an existing passion or trying something new!

### **Trips and visits**

We ensure a substantial range of trips allowing students to expand horizons, learn outside the class-room and develop important life skills. Opportunities range from simple local events such as theatre shows, to adventurous World Challenge trips to Iceland and Costa Rica. We operate the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme for students in Year 9 and above.

### Leadership development

As well as specific leadership training, students undertake leadership roles in areas such as One School Ambassadors, Peer Mentors, Language Ambassadors, Performing Arts Ambassadors and the prestigious Head Girl teams. Students will regularly lead school events including our cultural days and primary school outreach.

### WORKING TOGETHER: — A FOCUS ON THE INDIVIDUAL

As part of the working together element of our vision we ensure that every student's individual needs and interests are catered for through the following:

### **Excellent pastoral care**

All students are placed in a college, with each college benefitting from an Engagement Support Leader (ESL) who ensures pastoral care and support within the College community. Students quickly get to know their ESL and work together to ensure they are happy and settled in school.

### Additional wellbeing and mental health support

In addition to the above we employ a range of pastoral staff and agencies who can provide further support as required, ensuring all students are able to overcome any personal barriers to future growth.

### Personalised learning in lessons and through our E-Learning Scheme

Our highly successful E-Learning Scheme alongside a strong focus on regular teacher feedback means that students are able to receive exactly the learning they require, with teachers adapting lessons to suit individuals.


### **Celebration of talents and interests**

We are very keen to get to know all students, including what makes every young person special. To achieve this we use form time activities which have been instigated through discussions with students. We reward talents through our behaviour systems and regularly celebrate in assemblies and through social media.


### Regular communication on progress and learning

### ENJOYTHE JOURNEY –

The enjoy the journey part of our school vision is focussed on two key aims. Firstly, we want students to leave NSfG with many positive memories and secondly we have found that as students enjoy school they then engage more effectively with their learning.

### We support students to enjoy the journey through:

### **Excellent behaviour and a positive culture**

We are very proud of how students engage with our school and behave both in lessons and around the school. This helps to ensure that learning is productive and enjoyable as well as students feeling safe and settled in school.

### **Investing in positive relationships**

Through our well-established pastoral system we support students to develop positive relationships which build each other up and do not put down. There are clear and strong systems in place should students not meet this expectation.

### **Creating positive memories**

We offer a wide range of trips, clubs and experiences which help to create positive memories for all students, this includes our annual colour run and the whole school Christmas and summer trips to destinations such as Winter Wonderland, Thorpe Park and Harry Potter Studios.

### A valued reward system

Students are rewarded for engaging with our school through achievement points, which build towards a range of recognitions and reward events. This will include reward breakfasts and trips.

### A centre of excellence for all talents

Over the last few years we have been significantly investing in our school site to develop facilities that allow all students to develop their talents, this has included the Colyer Art Gallery, Power Hour Fitness Suite, Victoria Library, Northfleet Community Farm and a a fully professional recording studio!

## SUCCESS BEYOND SCHOOL

### **Thriving Sixth Form**

Our heavily over-subscribed Sixth Form provision attracts an above average number of students choosing to stay with us after GCSE studies, as well as a significant number joining from other schools.

### **Excellent Destinations**

We celebrate all students achieving careers in the areas they are passionate about and this includes aspirational university routes. An ever-increasing number of students leave for top level universities; including Russell Group institutions such as Oxford University. The range of professional subjects studied after our school is equally impressive, including Medicine, Law, Veterinary Studies, Psychology and Nursing .
