

WHAT IS QTS?

Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) is the professional status teachers gain in England at the end of their teacher training. Schools will look for QTS when recruiting teachers as this acts as a measure of their skills and experience.

The <u>Department of Education (DFE)</u> are helping Ukrainian teachers to gain employment in UK schools. From 1 February 2023, Ukrainians are now able to obtain Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) through the DFE's new professional recognition.

If you already have a teaching qualification in the Ukraine, you will not need to retrain in England. You will need the following:

- Teaching skills and experience
- Pass criminal and professional safeguarding checks (including DBS check by employer)
- A high standard of written and spoken English

FOR UP TO 4 YEARS WITHOUT QTS

If you are a qualified teacher outside of the UK you can still work as a teacher in maintained schools for up to 4 years without QTS.

Eligibility for the 4-year rule exemption:

- > Qualified as a teacher in a country outside the UK
- Completed a course of teacher training recognised by an organisation that regulates teachers in the country where you are qualified





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The 4-year rule doesn't apply to:

- > Pupil Referral Units
- > Alternative provision academies
- Alternative provision free schools

APPLY FOR QUALIFIED TEACHER STATUS (QTS)

From the **1st of February 2023**, if you have a teaching qualification from the following countries or regions, you can access this service:

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To be awarded QTS as a non-UK teacher, you must:

- Have an Undergraduate degree of the same academic standard as a UK Bachelor's degree, as verified by UK ENIC, the UK National Agency for International Qualifications and Skills.
- Have completed a course with content that is practically and pedagogically focused.
- Have at least one school year (a minimum of 9 months, including school holidays but excluding time out taken for any other reason) of professional experience working as a teacher after qualifying.
- Have completed teacher training that meets the standard of a level 6 qualification and is of at least the same length as an English Initial Teacher Training course – for example, a Bachelor of Education or a Postgraduate Certificate in Education.
- Be qualified to teach children aged between 5 and 16 years.
- Have the professional status needed to be a teacher in the country where you qualified and not be subject to any conditions or restrictions on your practice.

To be awarded QTS you will need to meet the criteria. <u>Click here</u> to find out about the qualifications needed to get QTS. You can apply for QTS via the DFE website <u>here</u>. There's no charge to apply for QTS. You do not need to be in the UK to use this service.

Having QTS does not guarantee a teaching job in a school or give you the right to work in England. You'll still need to apply for:



A teaching job



The correct visa or status

VISA FOR UKRAINIANS WANTING TO WORK AS TEACHERS IN THE UK

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TEACHING IN THE UK

If you're already living in England, you will need a **visa** or **immigration status** to work. You can apply for a skilled worker visa once you have been offered a teaching job with a school that can sponsor you.

You have the right to work or train as a teacher in England if you have the following:

- The <u>Ukraine Family Scheme visa</u>
- The <u>Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme</u>
- The <u>Ukraine Extension Scheme</u>

If you want to check the status of your visa:

- Apply to stay in the UK under the <u>Ukraine</u>
 <u>Extension Scheme</u>

SAFEGUARDING CHECKS

Schools will need to access your suitability to teach, including:



2 references from previous employers



Employment history



Criminal Record Check



Evidence of professional standing in Ukraine, e.g. documentation from the Ministry of Education and Science showing you are qualified and there are no sanctions against you as a teacher

CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK

You can apply to the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Ukraine for a criminal record check, which can be emailed to you. You can also contact the Ukrainian Embassy in the UK for a translation of the criminal record check and letter confirming its validity.

APPLY FOR A TEACHING JOB IN KENT

You could also consider <u>Teaching Assistant or Support Roles</u> in schools. You can gain experience working in English schools in these roles before applying for a teaching position. You are not required to have Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) to apply for a teaching assistant or support role.






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Once you have created an account with Kent-Teach, you can complete your digital online application form for future use. Completing this application form allows you to apply for jobs on Kent-Teach, where schools use the Kent-Teach online application method.
