

Qualifications.

Candidates will be required to demonstrate that they have:

- · Qualified Teacher Status.
- Achieved, or are working towards NPQH status.
- Evidence of further professional development in preparation for educational leadership.

Experience.

To be a successful candidate, you will be able to provide evidence that demonstrates your experience of:

- Successful senior leadership (Head Teacher or Deputy Head Teacher) within primary education, including Early Years, leading in a constructive and sensitive manner
- Managing and leading change, maintaining a fair and open workplace culture, demonstrating the ability to resolve successfully a range of personnel issues.
- Working positively with the Governing Body to define the strategic direction for the school and monitoring progress against those criteria.
- Analysing and using school performance data, to form both short and long-term improvement plans. Monitoring and evaluating data to drive up standards in teaching and learning to ensure that all pupils, including vulnerable groups, fulfil their potential.
- Implementing and monitoring the necessary processes for effective safeguarding and promotion of children's welfare and engagement with multi-agency teams to provide support to children and their families.
- Staff performance management, including supervision, development, target setting, capability assessments and conduct management procedures.
- Regular collaboration with all stakeholders to enhance learning for pupils within your school and the sharing of expertise with others e.g. colleagues, Head Teachers, LA Officers.
- Working with the necessary specialists within and outside the school to develop programmes of support for children with a range of barriers to their inclusion and learning.

Skills and abilities.

The successful candidate will be able to:

- Lead with optimism, continually building and developing positive relationships with pupils, staff, parents, carers, governors and the wider community.
- Effectively recruit deploy, manage and monitor staff, including developing leadership capacity and skills within teams and individuals.
- Develop, manage and monitor school budgets.
- Demonstrate resilience under pressure, determine priorities, delegate effectively and meet deadlines in an efficient manner.
- Communicate and convey information for differing purposes, and to different audiences, using a variety of media to ensure audience understanding.
- Remain positive, flexible and enthusiastic. Adopt adaptive and creative approaches to challenges, delegating effectively where necessary.
- Articulate and effectively implement a range of high-impact school improvement strategies.
