Starting School

Parents are very welcome to visit the school to meet the Headteacher and Staff and to see the school at work.

Meetings are also arranged for parents to find out more about how they can be involved when children start school. They will also be able to hear from the class teacher how the children’s day will be organised. The school undertakes the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum in accordance with National and County guidelines.

Curriculum Matters

We follow the National Curriculum, and children’s progress is measured against National Curriculum levels. Assessment is made through formal testing and teacher assessment.

National testing takes place at the end of Key Stage 1 (age 7) and Key Stage 2 (age 11). At the end of Year R, children are measured against the Early Years Profile, Foundation Stage. Children’s levels are reported to parents through end of year reports.
