



would say that dyslexia is like an impossible puzzle, you try to connect things together just like anybody else would, but you can't seem to find that one piece that finishes it all off. This is because our brain can't focus on that one PIECE of puzzle, but the thing is, you need that one piece of puzzle in order to finish the whole puzzle. So we ask for help because we think that will help us finish the puzzle (as we should). But the puzzle piece was in front of us the whole time, so the other person thinks that we are stupid, because it was really easy to find that bit of puzzle. So this makes us really upset and really annoyed, which then makes us ashamed of asking for help because we just get told we are stupid all of the time over some things that someone else may find really easy.
