Job title: Class teacher – primary school

Main purpose

The teacher will:

- Fulfil the professional responsibilities of a teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document
- · Meet the expectations set out in the Teachers' Standards

Duties and responsibilities

Teaching

- In collaboration plan and teach well-structured, creative lessons to assigned classes, following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work
- Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils
- · Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils
- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge
- Work as part of the year group team, supporting and encouraging others
- Participate in arrangements for preparing pupils for internal and/or external tests

Whole-school organisation, strategy and development

- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's values and vision
- Where relevant, subject leadership responsible for developing the subject curriculum from Early Years to year 6
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to secure co-ordinated outcomes

Health, safety and behaviour

- · Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils
- Maintain good order and behaviour among pupils; managing behaviour effectively to ensure a respectful, engaging and safe learning environment

Professional development

- Engage in the school's appraisal procedures
- Take part in further training and development in order to improve own teaching
- Undertake educational research, as part of teaching practice and professional development. Engage
 with the wider teaching community through participating in activities such as Swale Research Hub,
 Gateway Alliance moderations and Kent MAT Alliance activities such as subject forums and CPD

Where appropriate, take part in the appraisal and professional development of others

Communication

Communicate effectively and professionally with pupils, parents and carers

Working with colleagues and other relevant professionals

- Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school
- Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues
- Work as a cohesive part of the Trust community, supporting colleagues and contributing to the community as a whole

Personal and professional conduct

- Uphold public trust in the profession and maintain high standards of ethics and behaviour, within and outside school
- Have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school, and maintain high standards of attendance and punctuality
- Understand and act within the statutory frameworks setting out their professional duties and responsibilities

Management of resources (and other staff if applicable)
