Job Description: Cleaner

Grade: Kent Range 2 **Hours:** 10 hours per week

Weeks: Term-time only (38 weeks) plus inset days plus 3 weeks deep cleaning

Reports to: Headteacher

This is a permanent position (subject to a 6 month probationary period)

Purpose of the job

• Clean and maintain areas of the school in a timely manner, under the direction of the Caretaker, to uphold high standards of cleanliness and hygiene throughout

Key duties and responsibilities

- Provide a comprehensive cleaning service to allocated areas including dusting, vacuuming, washing floors, emptying bins and other similar tasks to maintain a high standard of cleanliness and hygiene at all times. Replenish hand towels, toilet rolls and soap to ensure areas are clean, neat and tidy.
 - During term time all rooms, including kitchen and cleaner's room, to be swept and/or vacuumed every day, floors, except hall floor, to be mopped daily, tables to be cleaned each day' other furniture, doors, window-sills and ledges to be dusted weekly.
 - Toilet floors to be swept and mopped daily with germicidal agent, WC bowels, urinal, toilet seats, taps, chains and door handles to be cleaned and disinfected daily, toilet rolls and paper towels to be replenished daily
 - The inside of windowpanes to head high to be cleaned termly, glass interior doors and mirrors to be cleaned weekly
 - Hall floor washed daily and resurfaced annually
 - Undertake specific cleaning and maintenance which cannot be completed during term time, e.g. stripping, re-sealing hall floor, cleaning behind moveable furniture, cleaning all furniture, moving resources as necessary, washing doors and walls, etc dependent upon length of holiday.
- Collect and dispose of waste
- Undertake specialised cleaning programmes, during school closures. Complete a deep clean of all
 areas including window cleaning, moving furniture to clean behind it, skirting boards, polishing
 wooden floors, machine scrubbing non-slip etc to ensure all areas are clean and fresh

Health and Safety

- Comply with the requirements of Health and Safety at Work regulations
- Take reasonable care for the Health and Safety of yourself and others, including adherence to 'lone working' guidelines
- Cooperate with the school to ensure that Health and Safety responsibilities are carried out
- Perform duties in line with health and Safety and COSHH regulations and take action where hazards are identified, reporting serious hazards immediately to the Headteacher or other senior person

Resources

- Use manual tools and power tools for appropriate repair and maintenance tasks. Cleaning
 equipment, including buffing machine and cleaning chemicals, will be used on regular basis. Training
 will be arranged as necessary
- Seek out new resources that will improve the cleanliness and enhance the school
- Have understanding of how to operate school alarm. Training will be arranged as necessary

Knowledge and Skills

• Willingness to undertake training, possibly off site and to attend meetings required to satisfactorily carry out the above requirements

Supervision and Management

• The post holder will often be required to work without direct supervision i.e. during school holidays, following lone working guidelines as necessary

Key contacts and relationships

- Daily contact with the Headteacher or other nominated staff
- Build positive relationships with school staff, responding willingly to reasonable requests for assistance
- Be prepared to be flexible, on occasions, to stay beyond designated finishing time in return for overtime payment or time off in lieu e.g. Open Evenings, Concerts

Some lifting is required. Routine cleaning may include the movement and handling of cleaning equipment, machinery and school furniture

Any other reasonable tasks as requested.
