- To be involved in positive interactions with children by supporting or providing stimulating activities that respond to their interests and developmental needs;

- To work with a range of people including school staff, visiting professionals and agencies, parents, children and families;
- To promote positive values and attitudes, and good child behaviour, dealing promptly
