Job Description – Head of Computing

Core purpose of the job

The Head of Computing is required to:

- 1) Maintain and develop a first-class Computing curriculum, delivering high quality learning opportunities to all pupils in Years 3-8
- 2) Support and train colleagues on ways to incorporate meaningful use of technology in their lessons and promote safe use of technology across the community
- 3) Work with key colleagues in Pre-Prep (Nursery to Year 2) to ensure continuity of learning across Key Stages

Responsible to: The Governors, the Head, the Deputies and the Director of Digital Strategy.

Key Responsibilities

1. Delivering the Computing Curriculum

- Maintaining fit-for-purpose and well-balanced Computing schemes of work for Years 3-8, staying in touch with new developments in education technology and incorporating them intelligently
- Teaching high quality Computing lessons to all Year 3-8 classes, tailoring learning opportunities to meet the needs of the learners across the ability range
- Regularly assessing pupil progress and attainment to inform planning and reporting to parents
- Managing the departmental budget and development plan
- Meeting and upholding the professional teachers' standards at all times
- Providing co-curricular opportunities for wider exploration of the subject, including running the established Digital Leader program

2. Promoting IT in the St Michael's Community

- Supporting colleagues to identify opportunities to make effective use of technology in their lessons
- Leading staff training for the purposes of refreshing skills or introducing new developments
- Promoting and raising the profile of IT through delivery of assemblies, clubs, parent workshops, school website Computing pages, newsletter articles etc.

3. Ensuring Continuity Across Key Stages

- Liaising with key colleagues in Pre-Prep to ensure coherence in the Computing curriculum
- Supporting smooth transition from KS1 to KS2 Computing through involvement with Year 2
- Maintaining up-to-date knowledge of KS3 Computing curricula being delivered by destination schools and ensuring that St Michael's leavers are well prepared for their onward transition
