The Geography Department

The Geography Department at Hillview School for Girls is an enthusiastic and cohesive department. The department has 4 dedicated classrooms and a large office, providing work space with computers for staff. We also teach Travel and Tourism at GCSE and A-Level.

Staffing

The Department's staff includes 4 teachers, they are expected to teach across KS3-KS5 and be prepared to teach some Travel and Tourism. The department is involved in initial teacher training: staff from the department deliver part of the theoretical aspects of teacher training as well as the day-to-day practical mentoring of trainees.

Courses

Hillview School for Girls has a 2 week timetable, consisting of 25 periods per week. Each period is 1 hour in duration. In the fortnight, Years 7 and 9 have 3 lessons, whereas year 8 have 2 lessons.

Year 10 and Year 11 have 5 lessons a fortnight and they follow the AQA specification. Years 12 and 13 follow the Pearson Edexcel specification and have 9 hours of study per fortnight with an additional fortnightly assessment hour, which is supervised directed study time. Our Schemes of Work are adapted from the national curriculum and are all designed in order for the students to become global citizens and be more aware of the physical and human world today. Classes in Geography are all mixed ability, we have high expectations of all our students.

Extracurricular activities

The extracurricular offer for students includes clubs such as Geography club and Eco club (run with Science). The department run revision sessions and drop-ins to support students at Key Stage 4 and 5. We also run a range of fieldtrips: Year 7 Bluewater, Year 9 Margate, Year 11 London and Year 13 Spain for their NEA.
