Core Purpose:

Provide a comprehensive technical service to teaching staff in the ADT Department and to enable the smooth running of the subject in general and by ensuring that apparatus is operating properly and safely for the use in practical lessons.

In your role as Art / Design and Technology Technician, you will be working alongside a fantastic range of specialisms including, Art, Food, 3D Design and Photography, as a growing department we seek to introduce courses in Textiles and Graphics in the coming years. Your role would be to support students throughout their learning journey. To ensure a healthy and safe work environment through the routine maintenance of machinery and equipment.

Responsible for:

The postholder will be responsible for duties covering apparatus and materials for experiments, initiating orders, health & Safety of laboratories and working areas and IT support.

Specific responsibilities

- To have the knowledge or commitment to solve technical problems in the form of machines or equipment queries in all areas of Art, Design and Technology.
- Use of Laser cutter, 3D printing and CAD experience is essential.
- Use of relevant software such as 2D Design/Solidworks/Sketch up/Photoshop essential/ desirable.
- Restock equipment across all areas of Art, Design and Technology
- To prepare materials & equipment for practical lessons across Art, Design and Technology
- Placing orders for resources and completing deliveries on a regular basis across Art, Design and Technology
- Providing technical support during some practical lessons e.g. organising equipment, assisting with organisation before and during the lesson, storing students' practical outcomes safely and offering technical support to students in the subject areas..
- Maintaining high standards of hygiene, safety and cleanliness in food technology you will be required to use safe storage of food items.
- Have some experience of mounting displays for exhibitions and display boards for GCSE and A level work. Support with the promotion of ADT competitions and outreach projects.
- To maintain and monitor consumables and equipment to ensure all pupils are able to access a wide range materials and processes as part of their provision.
- To maintain machinery and equipment in accordance with Health & Safety requirements.
- Carry out Health and Safety checks on all equipment and machinery.
- Responsibility for maintaining DT/Art equipment related to occupational health and safety principles, including keeping up with all the files and maintaining a safe environment.
- To provide first aid support as appropriate
- Helping to set up and design the Science preparation room and classrooms
- Carrying out risk assessments for practical and technical activities



Financial Accountabilities
