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School Organisation

Wittersham Church of England Primary School is a family. As we are a small rural school with 140 children on roll, we are given the unique opportunity to build strong bonds across year groups and classes. Staff and pupils build strong bonds and this enables us to ensure we support children in the most effective methods possible.

We have five classes, each with approximately 30 children in, other than our Year 6 class which has 20. Our school organisation is as follows:
