We are deeply committed to promoting the strong relationship between home, school, and parish as we feel that this partnership is the key to producing the best possible education, within and beyond the classroom.


Our team of dedicated professionals go above and beyond every day to ensure children have the best education and live life to the fullest through our values of Respect, Honesty and Love.


In addition to the Teaching Assistant job description, HLTAs will complement the professional work of teachers by taking responsibility for agreed learning activities under an agreed system of supervision. This will involve: some planning, preparing, and delivering learning activities when required for whole classes/small groups; some monitoring and assessing of pupils; recording and reporting on pupil's achievement, progress and development.

Your supportive role will enable children and their families to access good educational provision as soon as they join our school.

Key Responsibilities



Job Purpose - To support children and to support the class teacher in the provision of excellent learning opportunities.

- Work under the direction of the class teacher with individuals or small groups through play or planned activities.
- Deliver Learning activities to pupils within an agreed system of supervision, adjusting activities according to pupil responses/needs.
- Supervise and assist with activities as required giving feedback to the class teacher.
- Play alongside children, modelling language and personal, emotional and social skills.
- Support pupils to understand instructions, facilitate independent learning and inclusion of all pupils.
- Assist in the delivery and assessment of early reading and phonic activities.
- Assist in the monitoring and assessment of activities / interventions, recording progress as and when required.
- Support the teacher in behaviour management and monitor pupil's social and emotional wellbeing, reporting to the teacher as appropriate. This will include some break time duties and facilitating games and activities.
- Liaise and communicate with parents, under the direction of the class teacher, reporting back any necessary information.
- Assist with the administration of first aid and the care of sick children consulting with senior members of staff if necessary.
- Work in co-operation with all staff to ensure that resources and equipment are maintained in a clean, safe condition and are stored appropriately.
- Attend training opportunities such as courses and development days when appropriate.





- Help prepare and clear the learning environment and resources, including photocopying, displays and the presentation of pupils' work.
- Contribute to maintaining a safe environment and uphold all safeguarding responsibilities.
- Deliver local and national learning strategies e.g., literacy, numeracy, early years and make effective use of opportunities provided by other learning activities to support the development of pupils' skills.
- Use ICT effectively to support learning activities and develop pupils' competence and independence in its use.
- Select and prepare resources necessary to lead learning activities, taking account of pupil's interests and language and cultural backgrounds.
- Within an agreed system of supervision, plan challenging teaching and learning objectives to evaluate and adjust lessons/work plans as appropriate.
- Monitor and evaluate pupil responses to learning activities through a range of assessment and monitoring strategies against pre-determined learning objectives.
- Provide objective and accurate feedback and reports as required on pupil achievement, progress, and other matters, ensuring the availability of appropriate evidence.
- Record progress and achievement in lessons/activities systematically and providing evidence of range and level of progress and attainment.
- Work within an established behaviour policy to anticipate and manage behaviour constructively, promoting self-control and independence.
- Assess the needs of pupils and use detailed knowledge and specialist skills to support pupil's learning.
- Establish productive working relationships with pupils, acting as a role model and setting high expectations.
- Implement Individual Education/Behaviour Plans and Personal Care Programmes where relevant
- Promote the inclusion and acceptance of all pupils within the classroom.
- Encourage the pupils to interact and work co-operatively with others and engage pupils in activities.
- Support the development and effectiveness of the team, providing supervision and mentoring to other Teaching Assistants.
- Participate in training and other learning activities and performance development as required.


