Scholarship Programmes

At Cornwallis Academy we are really proud to offer a number of scholarships for students who demonstrate outstanding aptitude in Football, Dance and Art.

Football Scholarship

We offer a subsidised Football Scholarship, which includes weekly training sessions at Cornwallis Academy with Maidstone United UEFA Qualified Coaches; regular fixtures and a place at the PDC (Player Development Centre). This will provide students with a 5-year progression plan with the opportunity to graduate into the Post-16 Football Academy.



Dance Scholarship

We offer a tailored dance curriculum with additional dance lessons each week taught in collaboration with Maidstone Dance Studios. Students will have the opportunity to work with professionals and will be exposed to a variety of genres focusing on both choreographic and technical skills, to ensure all scholars reach their full potential. Scholars will complete a Dance leadership qualification and will be provided with a Dance Uniform.



Art Scholarship

In the Cornwallis Art Department, we are ambitious for students who excel visually to have opportunities to be nurtured and supported. Students will work with specialist Art Teachers who will encourage them to try new things and stretch their abilities. The focussed workshops will provide students with the confidence and ability to express their ideas and prepare them for exceptional outcomes in GCSE, A Level and Higher Education.

Wellbeing and Support

The wellbeing of our students is paramount at Cornwallis Academy.

Each year group has its own year zone and students meet their form tutor on a daily basis to receive support and guidance.

We also have a dedicated team of staff who look after the students' academic and pastoral needs. Furthermore, students are encouraged to adopt a healthy lifestyle through a range of physical and social activities, and this positive outlook is promoted throughout the school. Our key aim is to promote positive working relationships and personal responsibility, as well as leadership opportunities.

Starting Secondary School

To help make the transition from primary to secondary school as smooth as possible, we offer a broad programme of events to ensure students feel confident and prepared ahead of starting Year 7.

Our events include a unique transition day full of engaging activities, two traditional induction days for students, as well as an information evening for parents. New parents and students are also invited to attend one-to-one meetings with the Senior Leadership Team to discuss their needs and interests.

In the summer months, we run a successful Year 5 outreach programme that provides primary school children the opportunity to become familiar with the school and our staff, while enjoying taster sessions for a variety of subjects.

Our priority is to ensure that new students settle into the school as quickly as possible and that their academic attainment is recognised and extended into Year 7 and beyond.

Extra-Curricular

Students are encouraged to fully participate in the life of the school; we have a club to suit everyone's interests and aspirations. We boast over 40 extra-curricular clubs, including Maths, English, Sport, Performing Arts and Science to name a few.

These trips allow our students to be independent and develop both academically and socially.







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Post-16

We offer a rich and diverse range of post-16 courses to suit everyone, including a range of academic and vocational subjects. We also offer our students the opportunity to gain qualifications with reputable sporting academies and clubs.

Students who enrol in our Sixth Form have the benefit of accessing a wide variety of subjects and qualifications in familiar surroundings, with staff who know their strengths and needs.
