Job Title:	Teacher of Chemistry

### Job Purpose

The Duke of York's Royal Military School seeks an enthusiastic and dedicated Chemistry Teacher to join our dynamic, highly effective Science Faculty. The successful candidate will be an enthusiastic Teacher of Chemistry and a model of engaging and ambitious practice. You will have experience of delivering Chemistry in Key Stages 3, 4 and 5 and will contribute to the continued development of teaching and learning, building upon the excellent foundations already established. You will be committed to ensuring an aspirational, relevant and engaging curriculum is delivered to all our students.

In addition, the successful candidate will be required to play an active role in boarding School life, including: tutoring; clubs and activities during the day; boarding duties in the evenings and at weekends. In return, a DOYRMS allowance of £6,689 per annum will be payable.

### Key Duties and Responsibilities

#### Teacher of Chemistry:

- Demonstrate high expectations in the planning, delivery and assessment of Key Stage 3 Science and Key Stage 4 and 5 Chemistry.
- Have a developed knowledge and understanding of the Science and Chemistry curriculums and related pedagogy, including how learning progresses within them.
- Be flexible, creative and adept at designing learning sequences within lessons and across lessons that are effective and consistently well-matched to learning objectives and the needs of learners and which integrate recent developments, including those relating to subject/curriculum knowledge.
- Have an extensive knowledge and understanding of how to use and adapt a range of teaching, learning and behaviour management strategies, including how to personalise learning to provide opportunities for all learners to achieve their potential.
- Make accurate assessment of students' knowledge, understanding and skills; offering effective feedback for development.
- Be accountable for students' attainment, progress and outcomes, challenging underperformance through supportive interventions.
- Communicate effectively with parents with regards to students' achievements and well-being.
- To provide continuity of learning should students be absent from School.
- To encourage cross-curricular links with other departments.

**Boarding Tutor:**

  - Monitor Prep time pro-actively, to promote academic excellent and achievement.
- Take responsibility for the House on a maximum of 12 weekend days throughout the academic year, as required by the Housemaster/mistress.
- To assist the Housemaster/mistress, as agreed, in organising and running social, sporting, or other House activities for the students in the House.
- To attend pastoral team meeting and case conferences as required by the Housemaster/mistress.
- Contribute to the School's co-curricular programme.
