- Set and mark classwork, homework, in-year assessments, end-of-year examinations, entrance examinations and scholarship assessments

- Keep consistent records of pupils' progress and contribute to whole school data tracking
- Take lead responsibility for a form group, including communication with the parents, monitoring progress, mentoring, report writing, planning and delivering appropriate and valuable form time activities and assemblies in line with the guidance given by the Pastoral Leader.
- Attend parents' evenings for all classes taught
- Prepare pupil reports inline with the school schedule and protocol
- Attend required CPD courses
- Attend all staff and department meetings including INSET at the start of each term
- Attend Open Mornings and Enrichment Education Days
- Run a weekly co-curricular, extra-curricular or club after school or at lunch time.
- Carry out a weekly break or lunchtime duty
- Maintain a positive, proactive and professional approach with parents and colleagues
- Actively promote good behaviour amongst pupils employing the whole school behaviour policy
- Organise and participate in educational visits
- Attend some occasions such as concerts, play, matches and other parent/staff social events as required
- Other duties as occasionally directed by the Head or Deputy Head
