Job Title: STEM Teacher (Maths, Science, and Statistics)

Reporting to: Senior Leadership Team

Location: Haven Nook School

Purpose of the Role:

To deliver high-quality, engaging lessons in **Higher Maths**, **Statistics GCSE**, and **Science** to students in Key Stage 3 and 4. The role will involve developing creative and personalised teaching strategies to ensure that students with special educational needs (SEN) can access the curriculum and achieve their academic potential. The successful candidate will play an integral role in supporting students' academic and personal development, working in a nurturing and supportive learning environment.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Teaching and Learning:

- a. Plan, prepare, and deliver high-quality lessons in Higher Maths,
 Statistics GCSE, and Science that engage, challenge, and motivate students.
- b. Use differentiated teaching methods and resources to meet the individual learning needs of all students, ensuring that all students can access and succeed in the curriculum, including those with SEN.
- c. Ensure a positive and inclusive classroom environment that promotes emotional and social development, in line with the **Thrive Approach**.
- d. Assess, monitor, and evaluate students' progress, providing constructive feedback and support to help them improve.
- e. Manage classroom behaviour in a consistent and positive manner, establishing clear expectations and promoting a positive learning environment.

2. Curriculum Development:

- a. Work closely with colleagues in the school to ensure the curriculum is sequenced and appropriately differentiated to meet the needs of all students.
- b. Contribute to the development and implementation of schemes of work that align with the school's ethos and mission.
- c. Ensure that students are prepared for **GCSE exams** and other relevant qualifications, providing guidance and support as necessary.

3. Student Support and Wellbeing:

- a. Build positive, trusting relationships with students, understanding their individual needs and providing emotional and academic support.
