The successful candidate will take an active role in the day-to-day running of our well-established PE and Sports Faculty: supporting teachers with preparation; aiding lesson delivery and contributing to our extensive co-curricular programme. Working closely with PE staff and coaches, you will assist in leading sports teams from Y7-13, furthering students' enjoyment and competence. The successful candidate will have background and expertise in Hockey and Netball.

We offer our coaches a memorable experience, working amazing students in a flourishing co-educational environment. You will develop coaching skills alongside pastoral understanding and experience – invaluable for anyone interested in pursuing a teaching or coaching career.

Accommodation and food are provided as part of the remuneration package, as you will play an important role in supporting the well-being our boarding students, through the provision of co-curricular sessions and weekend fixtures in sport.
