Overview of Job:

We are looking for a well-qualified, enthusiastic teacher of Religion and Philosophy to join our school. You will be required to teach across all the Key Stages. Religion and Philosophy is very popular at both GCSE and A Level and this post provides an excellent opportunity for an experienced teacher who would like to develop their teaching further, or for an outstanding and ambitious ECT who would like to start their career teaching very able students.

Purpose of the Job:

- To deliver high quality and creative lessons of Religion & Philosophy.
- To assist in curriculum development within the department including the writing of Schemes of Work as well as other materials and resources.
- To actively implement the aims and objectives of the department and of the whole school.
- To participate in the further development and implementation of departmental policies and practices.
- To assist the Head of Department in maintaining and improving standards within the department.

Specific Responsibilities and Key Tasks:

- To teach the courses adopted by the department to a high standard through careful planning. To teach Religion & Philosophy at Key Stage 3, 4 and 5. The school currently teaches the AQA GCSE course and the OCR A Level course.
- To regularly mark students' work in line with school and department policy and to keep accurate and up to date records of student progress and achievement in accordance with the requirements of departmental practice.
- To use ICT appropriately in teaching and learning. To attend ICT/CPD training as necessary. To use the
