Main purpose of the role:	To work support teaching and learning for SEN pupils as a part of a team under the immediate direction of a class teacher to whom you are responsible.
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Main duties

Duties and Responsibilities	• Assist with the Implementation of planned learning activities/teaching programmes as agreed with the teacher • Support pupils with learning on a 1:1 or group basis as required • Maintain and prepare resources used in the classroom throughout the day. • Hoist, dress, feed, toilet, shower/bath and change pupils as needed • Participate in the implementation of Education Health and Care Plans, Individual Education Programmes and support pupils' access to a differentiated curriculum (EQUALS, National Curriculum, ASDAN etc.) • Support with educational trips or other off-site activities, such as sports, swimming or residential stays. This may include taking part in physical educational activities. • Support visiting therapists in carrying out specific programmes as directed by the Class Teacher and or intervention programmes • When necessary, be involved in some direct contact with parents • Care for sick pupils, whenever necessary during the school day • Accompany pupils to appointments, as needed • Supervise pupils during break/lunch, in the lunch hall, classroom or outdoors • Provide feedback to the teacher on the performance of pupils • Support with evidence for learning • Proactive in supporting with behaviour • Administer, when trained, drugs or medicine to individual pupils whenever necessary. • Use relevant school systems and technology • Take part in personal development opportunities and staff training courses • Take part in or be represented at departmental meetings and whole staff meeting. • Respect the confidential nature of all information gained • When required, take on the role of Keyworker in respect of pupils. This will involve maintaining a student log and establishing regular contact and exchange of information between the school and the parents • Remain flexible in meeting the needs of our pupils and school by supporting pupils in any class. • Act as an ambassador for the Beacon School within the local community • Committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young persons at all times. • Be responsible directly to your Class teacher and Assistant Headteacher for the safety and wellbeing of pupils when left alone with them. • Undertake any other task or responsibility deemed reasonable by the Assistant Headteacher. <i>The duties may be varied to meet the changing demands of the school/pupils and these duties may therefore be changed at the discretion of the Assistant Headteacher and following consultation with you.</i>
