Purpose of the Role

The successful candidate will ensure the effective education, development and welfare of all pupils through high-quality teaching, strong pastoral care and a commitment to inclusive practice, while supporting the school's Christian vision and ambitious curriculum.

Teaching and Learning

- Hold consistently high aspirations for all pupils to achieve excellent progress and outcomes each year and at the end of Key Stage 2.
- Deliver a mastery approach to mathematics, developing fluency, reasoning and problem-solving.
- Use rich, high-quality texts to inspire reading, vocabulary and purposeful writing outcomes.
- Use Colourful Semantics and inclusive strategies to scaffold language and ensure all pupils can access learning.
- Embed the school's 'hands on, sheets off' philosophy through practical, active learning.
- Assess, monitor and adapt provision using national and school assessment systems. In the wider curriculum, embrace the use of floor books and pupil conferencing to assess progress and reduce unnecessary workload.
- Maintain high expectations of achievement, presentation, behaviour and conduct in line with school policy.

- Promote positive behaviour through nurturing relationships, clear routines and proactive classroom management.
