- Build strong relationships with parents, carers and the wider school community, recognising the importance of partnership in supporting children's learning and wellbeing.
- Promote high expectations for behaviour, attendance, presentation and engagement, using positive and restorative approaches in line with school policy.
- Encourage children to become increasingly independent, reflective and resilient learners who are able to think critically, persevere and take pride in their achievements.
- Contribute positively to wider school life through participation in staff meetings, professional development, school events, parent consultations and extra-curricular opportunities.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues across the school and Trust, sharing effective practice and contributing to wider school improvement.
