- Develop the students within school to provide effective stage crews for all relevant school and Creative Arts events
- To coordinate get in and get out for relevant school and Creative Arts events
- Support preparing risk assessments for all relevant events and productions
- Prepare lighting and/or sound designs for all relevant school and Creative Arts events
- Attend selected rehearsals as directed by the Creative Arts Technical Manager
- Undertake and coordinate technical duties under the direction of the Creative Arts Technical Manager within the Art & Design department to include technical support for Ceramics and Textiles
- To support the professional appearance of all Creative Arts venues
- To assist with maintenance of all Creative Arts technical resources including lanterns, microphones etc.
