Background

Maritime Academy Trust began as a partnership of three schools in Greenwich. The impact of our partnership work was striking – our schools transformed through targeted collaboration, innovative ideas and an entrepreneurial curriculum, firmly embedded in knowledge, that builds leadership and life skills into children. To secure this collaboration for the future, we created Maritime in 2016. Since then, our Trust has grown in strength, capacity and expertise.

We now serve 4000 pupils and 700 staff in thirteen schools across Greenwich, Bexley, Kent and Medway. We support the development of our schools in all aspects of education, finance, HR, IT, estates, operations and governance.

Our role as a Trust is to ensure meaningful collaboration drives improvement, innovation and efficiencies across the schools, enabling headteachers to focus on teaching and learning so every pupil can thrive.





Maritime Mindset

Community Engagement Manager

As our Community Engagement Manager, you'll lead and inspire a team of 5 Community Ambassadors who work alongside schools, families, and local partners to help build stronger, more connected communities.

You'll be joining us at an exciting stage in our journey. Together, we're creating a new model of community engagement that puts relationships at the heart of everything we do. This is an opportunity to shape something meaningful, helping schools become places where families feel they belong, local partnerships flourish, and communities come together to create opportunities for children to thrive.

At the heart of this role is people. You'll coach, encourage and develop our Community Ambassadors, creating the confidence, skills and support they need to make an even greater impact. You'll celebrate their successes, help turn ideas into action and foster a culture where collaboration, creativity and continuous learning are part of everyday life.

Working closely with our Head of Community Engagement, you'll help strengthen our approach across the Trust, ensuring community engagement isn't simply something our schools do, but something that becomes part of who we are. Every relationship built, every partnership created and every opportunity unlocked has the potential to make a lasting difference to children, families and the wider community.

To understand this role, it's helpful to first understand the role of our Community Ambassadors. They are at the heart of our community engagement work, building trusted relationships that help children, families and communities flourish together.

What Is A Community Ambassador

Schools are about so much more than education. They are places where relationships are built, families find support, and communities come together. But with teachers and senior leaders balancing so many responsibilities, finding the time to build those relationships can be a challenge.

That's why Maritime created the Community Ambassador role.

Community Ambassadors are dedicated members of staff who work 15 hours a week across two/three days to strengthen the connection between school, home and the wider community. They build trusted relationships with families, listen to what matters most, create opportunities for people to connect, and work alongside local organisations to bring support and opportunities into the school community.

More than anything, Community Ambassadors help schools become community hubs, places where every family feels welcomed, valued and connected.

Our roles as Community Ambassadors are a new model for schools, so we're building something new together. We work closely together and believe the best ideas come from sharing them. We keep communication open, honest and regular, making time to check in, share updates and celebrate what's working so we can all learn from each other.

We support one another by sharing knowledge, tools and ideas, and by helping each other make connections with the right people, organisations and opportunities. We know no one has all the answers, so we learn together.



Application Guidance

Thank you for your interest in working with the Maritime Multi-Academy Trust. This Application Guidance has been developed to help you to complete your application. Please take a few minutes to read through the information before filling out the application form.

Your application will be your first point of contact with the Trust. The content of your application will determine whether or not you will be invited to interview, therefore it is essential that you complete it as fully as possible. We will not make any assumptions about your abilities and do not take into account any previous applications.

CVs are not acceptable in the place of a completed application form and all candidates are required to address the criteria on the person specification for the post. However, you may submit a CV in addition to your completed application form.

Personal Details

Enter fully and clearly your name, address and telephone number(s) so that you can be easily contacted in the event that you are shortlisted to attend an interview.

Employment

State clearly your current or most recent employer's name and address. Include details of the post held and (if applicable) reason for leaving.

Previous Employment

Enter names and addresses of all previous employers, starting with the most recent. You can also include work experience placements, holiday jobs or voluntary work in which you have developed skills relevant to the job you are applying for. It is very important that you complete this section in chronological order, and detail accurately any gaps between employment and other activities.

Education

Provide full details of your education at secondary level and above along with details of degrees/diplomas and any other qualifications, including those that you are currently studying for. Make sure you give all the information required, including levels and grades of any examinations taken. If a required qualification has been specified for the role, make sure you give all the information required and levels of any examinations taken. You will be expected to provide documentary evidence if you are invited for an interview.

Supporting Statement

This section is very important. It gives you the opportunity to detail why you feel you are the best person for the job and why you are applying, and is the key information that is used for shortlisting. Before completing this section refer to the Job Description and Person Specification for the role.

Application Guidance

Add short Focus on how your skills, knowledge and experience meet each role requirement, detailed in the person specification giving specific examples. In completing this section you may refer to both paid and voluntary work and your experience within any school or any relevant experience outside

Referees

Provide the names, addresses and email addresses of two people who are willing and able to provide references in support of your application. One of these must be your current (or most recent) employer.

If you are not currently working with children but have done so in the past, the second referee should be the employer by whom you were most recently employed in work with children. Please note that family members, friends and relatives are not acceptable

Referees will be asked about past disciplinary actions or allegations excluding those that were deemed to be unfounded, unsubstantiated or malicious when assessing your application.

Eligibility to Work in the UK

If you are selected to attend for an interview you will be asked to provide documentary evidence of your right to work in the UK.

Declarations

If you are appointed, you will be required to complete an Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) application. The DBS will provide a report to you confirming whether you have any history of criminal convictions, including cautions and

All posts in schools are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974; this means you must declare all convictions,

The existence of a criminal background does not automatically mean that you cannot be appointed but it may do so.

We need to know if you have a close relationship with and/or are related to any employee, governor or anyone else connected to the school, in order to ensure a fair selection process.

If you have a disability please provide details of any adjustments that you will require if shortlisted for an interview. Any details you provide regarding a disability will be dealt with sensitively and will only be disclosed to staff involved in the selection process when it is considered appropriate and necessary.

Application Guidance

Before submitting your application form ensure that you take time to read it through to check for any errors or omissions. You may find it useful to keep a copy of your submitted application form to refer to if you are short listed for the post you are applying for. Your completed application must be submitted before the specified closing date.

Next Steps

You will be notified as to whether you have been shortlisted to attend an interview. It is the policy of the Trust that feedback is not provided to candidates at the shortlisting stage

Online Checks

In line with KCSIE guidance, as part of the shortlisting process, the Trust reserves the right to conduct an online search on shortlisted candidates as part of our due diligence and to share any pertinent information found concerning a candidate's suitability to work with children with Hiring Managers to be discussed at interview stage

Safeguarding

It is an offence to apply for a job if you are banned from working with children. Please see our policy statement on the recruitment of ex-offenders

Purpose of Job

Reporting to the Head of Community Engagement, you will lead on the professional development of the Community Ambassadors across the Medway Hub and champion new ways of working with community partners. This postholder will support the Community Ambassadors, turn great ideas into action, champion the stories and impact of our work, strengthen meaningful partnerships, and create opportunities for families to connect and belong.

Context

Our Community Ambassador role is a part-time school-based position that acts as a bridge between school and community. They build trusted relationships with families and the wider community, help connect families to support, and work with staff and local organisations to strengthen belonging, confidence, and community connections so all children and their families can thrive.

Job Description

Specific Responsibilities:

- Lead and support a team of 5 Community Ambassadors across the trust, helping them to grow in confidence, develop their skills, and thrive in their roles through coaching, learning opportunities, and the sharing of ideas and good practice. Support the team to build strong relationships with schools, families, and community partners, turning ideas into action and support them in delivering their initiatives that make a positive difference to communities.
- Bring our community stories to life by capturing and sharing the voices, experiences, and impact of our work. Use creative communications and social media to celebrate success, inspire engagement, and showcase the difference our schools and communities are making together.
- Work closely with the Head of Programmes and Impact to design and embed effective impact-gathering processes, bringing insights from community practice and ensuring Community Ambassadors have the support, tools, and confidence to capture meaningful evidence of impact.
- Shape and coordinate a programme of professional development opportunities for Community Ambassadors, helping them build the knowledge, skills, and confidence needed to deliver high-quality community engagement.
- Champion the development of convening groups across the trust, supporting schools to establish and sustain effective groups that bring together families, partners, and community stakeholders. Provide the relational and administrative support needed to help these groups thrive, including coordinating communication, maintaining relationships, organising meetings, and ensuring actions are followed through.
- To undertake any other work appropriate to the level and general nature of the post's duties.
