

After School Club Play Worker

MAIN PURPOSE OF THE JOB

To work under the guidance of the After School Club Leader, Extended School Leader and Head Teacher to provide child care for pupils attending the After School Club.

This position involves working closely with the children to provide encouragement, friendship and supervision. To assist the manager in offering the children a wide range of play activities and ensuring that the club offers the children a relaxed, informed and caring environment.

SUMMARY OF RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

1. Assist in the preparation of snacks, cleaning away and washing up when required.
2. To be responsible to a group of children as designated by the Play Leader.
3. Assist in ensuring that the children are safe at all times and drawing attention of the Play Leader to any likely causes of danger.
4. To attend occasional staff meetings.
5. To attend training sessions occasionally if required at a mutually agreed time and date.
6. To undertake any other task as required by management within the purpose of the job.
7. To accompany the children on outings, accepting responsibility for the whereabouts safety of a designated small group of children.
8. To inform the Play Leader immediately of any incident, which could be detrimental to the wellbeing of any child within the club's care.
9. To offer ideas and participate in new and improved play activities. This will involve offering a weekly activity, e.g. arts and crafts/physical/cooking.
10. To help set out activities before the children arrive.
