Job Description

KS4 and KS5 (GCSE and A Level) Subject Specific Support:

- To liaise with the Head of Department or dedicated subject member of staff overseeing catch up on which students support is to be provided for
- To know which students are expected for each session
- To keep an accurate log of attendance
- To take direction from HoD/Subject member of staff on work to be covered, but being responsive to student's requests
- To keep a shared log with student and HoD of the work covered
